 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "American Fisheries

5 Advisory Committee Act".

6 SEC. 2. AMERICAN FISHERIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

7 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—Section 2 of the Act of Au8 gust 11, 1939 (15 U.S.C. 713c-3) is amended by adding
9 at the end the following:

1	"(f) American Fisheries Advisory Committee.—
2	"(1) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:
3	"(A) COMMITTEE.—The term 'Committee'
4	means the American Fisheries Advisory Com-
5	mittee established under paragraph (2).
6	"(B) Marketing and promotion.—The
7	term 'marketing and promotion' means an ac-
8	tivity aimed at encouraging the consumption of
9	seafood or expanding or maintaining commer-
10	cial markets for seafood.
11	"(C) PROCESSOR.—The term 'processor'
12	means any person in the business of preparing
13	or packaging seafood (including seafood of the
14	processor's own harvesting) for sale.
15	"(D) SEAFOOD.—The term 'seafood'
16	means farm-raised and wild-caught fish or
17	shellfish harvested in the United States or by a
18	United States flagged vessel for human con-
19	sumption.
20	"(E) SEAFOOD INDUSTRY.—The term 'sea-
21	food industry' means harvesters, marketers,
22	growers, processors, and persons providing
23	them with goods and services.
24	"(2) Establishment.—Not later than 90 days
25	after the date of the enactment of the American

1	Fisheries Advisory Committee Act, the Secretary
2	shall establish five regions within the American
3	Fisheries Advisory Committee as follows:
4	"(A) Region 1 shall consist of Alaska, Ha-
5	waii, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mar-
6	iana Islands, and the Territories of Guam and
7	American Samoa.
8	"(B) Region 2 shall consist of Maine, New
9	Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Con-
10	necticut, New York, Michigan, Minnesota, Wis-
11	consin, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Pennsyl-
12	vania.
13	"(C) Region 3 shall consist of Texas, Ala-
14	bama, Louisiana, Mississippi, Florida, Puerto
15	Rico, and territory of the Virgin Islands.
16	"(D) Region 4 shall consist of California,
17	Washington, Oregon, and Idaho.
18	"(E) Region 5 shall consist of New Jersey,
19	Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina,
20	South Carolina, and Georgia.
21	"(3) Membership.—The Committee shall be
22	composed of the following members:
23	"(A) REGIONAL REPRESENTATION.—Each
24	of the regions listed in subparagraphs (A)

	_
1	through (E) of paragraph (2) shall be rep-
2	resented on the Committee by two members—
3	"(i) who are appointed by the Sec-
4	retary;
5	"(ii) who reside in a State or territory
6	in the region that the member will rep-
7	resent;
8	"(iii) of which—
9	"(I) one shall have experience as
10	a seafood harvester; and
11	"(II) one shall have experience as
12	a processor; and
13	"(iv) that are selected so that the
14	members of the Committee have experience
15	or expertise with as many seafood species
16	as practicable.
17	"(B) AT-LARGE MEMBERS.—The Secretary
18	shall appoint to the Committee at-large mem-
19	bers to ensure that the Committee fairly re-
20	flects the expertise and interest of the seafood
21	industry located in each region, as follows:
22	"(i) One individual with experience in
23	mass market food distribution.
24	"(ii) One individual with experience in
25	mass market food retail or food service.

1	"(iii) One individual with experience
2	in the marketing of seafood.
3	"(iv) One individual with experience
4	in growing seafood.
5	"(v) One individual who is an em-
6	ployee of the National Marine Fisheries
7	Service with expertise in fisheries research.
8	"(4) Member terms.—The term for a member
9	of the Committee shall be three years, except that
10	the Secretary shall designate staggered terms for the
11	members initially appointed to the Committee.
12	"(5) Responsibilities.—The Committee shall
13	be responsible for—
14	"(A) identifying needs of the seafood in-
15	dustry that may be addressed by a project
16	funded with a grant under subsection (c);
17	"(B) developing the request for proposals
18	for such grants;
19	"(C) reviewing applications for such
20	grants; and
21	"(D) selecting applications for approval
22	under subsection $(c)(2)(B)$.
23	"(6) CHAIR.—The Committee shall elect a chair
24	by a majority of those voting, if a quorum is
25	present.

	"(7) QUORUM.—A simple majority of members
2	of the Committee shall constitute a quorum, but a
3	lesser number may hold hearings.
4	"(8) MEETINGS.—
5	"(A) FREQUENCY.—The Committee shall
6	meet not more than two times each year.
7	"(B) LOCATION.—The meetings of the
8	Committee shall rotate between the geographic
9	regions described under paragraph (2).
10	"(C) FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
11	ACT.—The Federal Advisory Committee Act (5
12	U.S.C. App.) shall not apply to the Committee.
13	"(9) Staff.—The Committee may employ staff
14	as necessary without regard to the provisions of title
15	5, United States Code.
16	((10) Per diem and expenses and fund-
17	ING.—
18	"(A) IN GENERAL.—A member of the
19	Committee shall serve without compensation,
20	but shall be reimbursed in accordance with sec-
21	tion 5703 of title 5, United States Code, for
22	reasonable travel costs and expenses incurred in
23	performing duties as a member of the Com-
24	mittee.

"(B) FUNDING.—The reimbursements made under subparagraph (A) shall be paid with the funds made available for grants under subsection (c).

5 "(11) CONFLICT OF INTEREST.—The conflict of 6 interest and recusal provisions set out in section 7 302(j) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conserva-8 tion and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1852(j)) shall 9 apply to any decision by the Committee and to all 10 members of the Committee as if each member of the 11 Committee is an affected individual within the mean-12 ing of such section 302(j), except that in addition to 13 the disclosure requirements of section 302(j)(2)(C)14 of such Act, (16 U.S.C. 1852(j)(2)(C)), each mem-15 ber of the Committee shall disclose any financial in-16 terest or relationship in an organization or with an 17 individual that is applying for a grant under sub-18 section (c) held by the member of the Committee, in-19 cluding an interest as an officer, director, trustee, 20 partner, employee, contractor, agent, or other rep-21 resentative.".

(b) ROLE IN APPROVAL OF GRANTS.—Section
23 2(c)(3) of the Act of August 11, 1939 (15 U.S.C. 713c–
24 3(c)(3)) is amended to read as follows:

"(3) No application for a grant under this subsection
 may be approved unless—
 "(A) the Secretary is satisfied that the appli-

4 cant has the requisite technical and financial capa5 bility to carry out the project; and

6 "(B) the application is selected for funding by
7 the American Fisheries Advisory Committee under
8 subsection (f).".
