2 **SEC. 302. FCC STUDY ON TELEVISION SPORTS PROGRAM-**
3 **MING COSTS TO CONSUMERS.**

4 (a) STUDY.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Federal Communica-
6 tions Commission shall conduct a study on the car-
7 riage of local, regional, and national sports program-
8 ming licensed by professional sports leagues, not in-
9 cluding college athletics, to broadcast networks,
10 cable networks, and regional sports networks and
11 the estimated impact of such programming on the

1 multichannel video programming distributor subscrip-
2 tion fees paid by consumers.

3 (2) REQUIREMENTS.—The study required
4 under paragraph (1) shall investigate and analyze
5 trends between 2006 and 2015 on—

6 (A) television sports programming distribu-
7 tion models including sports programming li-
8 censing deals with broadcast networks, cable
9 networks, and regional sports networks;

10 (B) fees paid by broadcast networks, cable
11 networks, and regional sports networks to li-
12 cense local, regional, and national sports pro-
13 gramming;

14 (C) the use of advertising revenue, con-
15 sumer subscription fees, retransmission fees,
16 and affiliate fees collected by broadcast net-
17 works, cable networks, regional sports networks,
18 and multichannel video programming distribu-
19 tors to offset the costs to license or distribute
20 television sports programming;

21 (D) the correlation between multichannel
22 video programming distributor subscription fees
23 paid by consumers and the costs broadcast net-
24 works, cable networks, and regional sports net-
25 works pay to license sports programming and

1 the costs multichannel video programming dis-
2 tributors pay to retransmit or distribute broad-
3 cast networks, cable networks, and regional
4 sports networks to consumers; and

5 (E) trends, on a sport-by-sport basis, in
6 the migration of local, regional, and national
7 sports programming from carriage by broadcast
8 networks to carriage over cable networks and
9 regional sports networks, including the eco-
10 nomic causes of such trends and the economic
11 consequences of such trends on consumers.

12 (b) REPORT.—Not later than December 15, 2015,
13 the Federal Communications Commission shall submit a
14 final report on the results of the study required under sub-
15 section (a) to the Committee on Energy and Commerce
16 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
17 Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate,
18 which shall include—

19 (1) a statement of the results, on a sport-by-
20 sport basis, of the analysis of the trends between
21 2006 and 2015 required under subsection (a); and

22 (2) such legislative or regulatory recommenda-
23 tions to lower the costs of multichannel video pro-
24 gramming distributor subscription fees paid by con-
25 sumers.
