I am humbled to be considered for appointment to Rear Admiral. If confirmed, I intend to continue serving the women and men of the U.S. Coast Guard to best position the Service to meet an increasingly demanding portfolio. As the Assistant Commandant for Prevention Policy, I've led the Coast Guard's efforts to eradicate sexual misconduct from the maritime industry. Partnering with the Maritime Administration and the Coast Guard Investigative Service, we have operationalized new legislation that expanded the Coast Guard's authority to investigate sexual misconduct cases and hold individuals and responsible entities accountable where warranted. Our joint efforts to engage and educate stakeholders, from CEO's of major maritime companies to new cadets/midshipmen at our state maritime academies, have reinforced our joint commitment to providing a safe workplace for all mariners. I have led delegations to the International Maritime **Organization**, representing U. S. interests to proactively improve shipping safety, environmental protection and security standards throughout the world. I have worked to develop outcome-based standards to address growing cybersecurity vulnerabilities and alternative fuels to reduce carbon emissions in shipping as the world becomes more interconnected. As an active recruiter, I have worked to find the best talent available so that the Service is prepared to meet the challenges of the future. In these and a myriad of other elements of the Prevention portfolio, I have relied on solid partnerships and collaboration to design, implement and execute policies to support the Nation's economic prosperity and national security.

23. What do you believe are your responsibilities, if confirmed, to ensure that the Coast Guard has proper management and accounting controls, and what experience do you have in managing a large organization?

It is each Coast Guard member's sworn duty to be a responsible steward of our Nation's resources. In my current role as the Assistant Commandant for Prevention Policy, I have established and maintained high standards for our service members, our stakeholders and the public. I have gained extensive experience managing and overseeing Coast Guard resources to maximize return on the public's investment in the Service throughout my career. My prior assignments have allowed me the opportunity to manage hundreds of personnel, millions of dollars, and significant responsibilities. These assignments have spanned a wide range of Coast Guard experiences from emergency preparedness and incident response operations in the field to multi-agency strategy, budget and policy development. As a Coast Guard Flag officer, I have allocated resources to best buy down risk while regularly assessing the effectiveness of those decisions to best meet the public's expectations for service.

24. What do you believe to be the top three challenges facing the Coast Guard, and why?

The top three challenges facing the Coast Guard all focus on readiness. Readiness can be defined by people, governance, and technology. The Coast Guard's ability to recruit and retain the necessary talent required to meet an increasing demand for service is paramount. We must continue to provide opportunities that will attract the Nation's best talent and then provide a workplace that nurtures innovation, creativity, belonging while also empowering leadership to find ways to keep them on the team. Given the rapid pace of technology advancements across the marine transportation system, we must re-think our own models for governance with a focus on performance/outcome-based standards. Technology evolves too quickly for legacy prescriptive regulatory models. As for technology, we must embrace the latest technologies, specifically with respect to data analysis, AI and machine learning to refine our operational models to best buy down risks across the Service.

In 2004, when I was a lieutenant commander, I was named as an alleged discriminating official in an EEO case. A military member who was leaving the service alleged discrimination based on race and gender when she was not selected for a civilian Port Security Specialist position. I was named because I had been directed to serve on the hiring panel for the open position and interviewed the complainant and another candidate. The other candidate was ultimately selected for the position by my superior because of his qualifications and extensive experience in the field. I did not serve as the supervisor of the complainant. After trial on the merits, the Coast Guard was found to not have discriminated in any way against the complainant.

Rear Admiral Arguin serves as the Assistant Commandant for Prevention Policy, and is responsible for the development of national policy, standards, and programs promoting Marine Safety, Security and Environmental Stewardship. Three Directorates carry out the mission: Inspections and Compliance, Marine Transportation Systems, and Commercial Regulations and Standards. Programs include waterways management, navigation and boating safety, ports and facilities, merchant mariner credentialing, vessel documentation, marine casualty investigation, commercial vessel inspections, and port state control.

Rear Admiral Arguin is a 1992 graduate of the Coast Guard Academy, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering and in 2001, he earned a Master of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering from the University of Michigan.



Prior to his current assignment, Rear Admiral Arguin served as the Director of Inspection and Compliance, also at Coast Guard Headquarters. His previous operational assignments include Sector Commander, Sector New Orleans. He also served as Executive Officer of Marine Safety Office Memphis, TN and Prevention Department Head at Sector Lower Mississippi River where he coordinated waterways management, vessel inspections, mariner licensing and marine casualty investigations on the Lower Mississippi River and its tributaries. In 1994, Rear Admiral Arguin earned his Marine Inspection qualifications at Marine Safety Office Hampton Roads and served as senior marine inspector performing commercial vessel and cruise ship inspections at Marine Safety Office Tampa, Florida. He was also assigned to USCGC HARRIET LANE (WMEC-903) as a student engineer and Damage Control Assistant (1992-1994).

His staff assignments include Director of Emerging Policy and Executive Officer, Hull Division Chief and Salvage Engineering Response Team (SERT) Leader at the Coast Guard's Marine Safety Center.
