1 At the appropriate place, insert the following:

2 **SEC. ____ . REPORT ON COLLECTION OF DRUG-IMPAIRED**
3 **DRIVING DATA.**

4 Not later than 3 years after the date of enactment
5 of this Act, the Secretary of Transportation, in consulta-
6 tion with the heads of appropriate Federal agencies, State
7 highway safety offices, and other interested parties, shall
8 submit to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and
9 Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on
10 Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Rep-
11 resentatives a report that—

1 (1) identifies any barriers that States encounter
2 in submitting to the Fatality Analysis and Reporting
3 System the alcohol and drug toxicology results of fa-
4 tally injured drivers;

5 (2) provides recommendations on how to ad-
6 dress any barriers identified under paragraph (1);

7 (3) makes recommendations relating to the cre-
8 ation and adoption of national minimum guidelines
9 for toxicological investigations in cases of motor ve-
10 hicle crashes and drug-impaired driving cases as a
11 way to improve reliability and consistency in toxi-
12 cology testing;

13 (4) reviews model guidelines, such as model
14 guidelines from the National Safety Council; and

15 (5) provides future steps that the Secretary,
16 acting through the Administrator of the National
17 Highway Traffic Safety Administration, will take to
18 assist States in improving—

19 (A) toxicology testing in cases of motor ve-
20 hicle crashes; and

21 (B) the reporting of alcohol and drug toxi-
22 cology results in cases of motor vehicle crashes.
