24	(d) Dogfish.—

1	(1) In general.—It shall not be a violation of
2	subsection bc) for any person to possess, transport,
3	offer for sale, sell, or purchase any fresh or frozen
4	raw fin or tail from any stock of the species
5	Mustelus canis (smooth dogfish) or Squalus
6	acanthias (spiny dogfish).
7	(2) Report.—By not later than January 1,
8	2027, the Secretary of Commerce shall review the
9	exemption contained in paragraph (1) and shall pre-
10	pare and submit to Congress a report that includes
11	a recommendation on whether the exemption con-
12	tained in paragraph (1) should continue or be termi-
13	nated. In preparing such report and making such
14	recommendation, the Secretary shall analyze factors
15	including—
16	(A) the economic viability of dogfish fish-
17	eries with and without the continuation of the
18	exemption;
19	(B) the impact to ocean ecosystems of con-
20	tinuing or terminating the exemption;
21	(C) the impact on enforcement of the ban
22	contained in subsection (b) caused by the ex-
23	emption; and
24	(D) the impact of the exemption on shark
25	conservation.

(e) DEFINITION OF SHARK FIN.—In this section, the 1 term "shark fin" means— 2 3 (1) the raw or dried or otherwise processed de-4 tached fin of a shark; or 5 (2) the raw or dried or otherwise processed de-6 tached tail of a shark. 7 (f) State Authority.—Nothing in this section may 8 be construed to preclude, deny, or limit any right of a State or territory to adopt or enforce any regulation or 10 standard that is more stringent than a regulation or 11 standard in effect under this section. 12 (g) SEVERABILITY.—If any provision of this section or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 14 15 applications of this section which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this section are severable.
