- 3 “(h) COMPLIANCE AUDITS.—
- 4 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Not less frequently than
- 5 annually, the Center shall carry out an audit of the
- 6 corporation, ^{and} each national governing body, ~~and each~~
- 7 ~~paralympic sports organization—~~

1 “(A) to assess compliance with policies and
2 procedures developed under this subchapter;
3 and

4 “(B) to ensure that consistent training re-
5 lating to the prevention of child abuse, is pro-
6 vided to all staff of the corporation, ^{and} national
7 governing bodies, ~~and paralympic sports organi-~~
8 ~~zations~~ who are in regular contact with amateur
9 athletes and members who are minors subject
10 to parental consent.

11 “(2) CORRECTIVE MEASURES.—

12 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Center may im-
13 pose on the corporation, ^{or} a national governing
14 body, ~~or a paralympic sports organization~~ a cor-
15 rective measure to achieve compliance with the
16 policies and procedures developed under this
17 subchapter or the training requirement de-
18 scribed in paragraph (1)(B).

19 “(B) INCLUSIONS.—A corrective measure
20 imposed under subparagraph (A) may include
21 the implementation of an athlete safety pro-
22 gram or specific policies, additional compliance
23 audits or training, and the imposition of a pro-
24 bationary period.

25 “(C) ENFORCEMENT.—

1 “(i) IN GENERAL.—On request by the
2 Center, the corporation shall—

3 “(I) enforce any corrective meas-
4 ure required under subparagraph (A);
5 and

6 “(II) report the status of enforce-
7 ment with respect to a national gov-
8 erning body ~~or paralympic sports or~~
9 ~~organization~~ within a reasonable time-
10 frame.

11 “(ii) METHODS.—The corporation
12 may enforce a corrective measure through
13 any means available to the corporation, in-
14 cluding by withholding funds from a na-
15 tional governing body ~~or paralympic sports~~
16 ~~organization~~, limiting the participation of
17 the national governing body ~~or paralympic~~
18 ~~sports organization~~ in corporation events,
19 and decertifying a national governing body
20 ~~or paralympic sports organization.~~

21 “(iii) EFFECT OF NONCOMPLIANCE.—
22 If the corporation fails to enforce a correc-
23 tive measure within 72 hours of a request
24 under clause (i), the Center may submit to
25 the Committee on Commerce, Science, and

1 Transportation of the Senate and the
2 Committee on Energy and Commerce of
3 the House of Representatives a report de-
4 scribing the noncompliance.

5 “(3) ANNUAL REPORT.—

6 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Not less frequently
7 than annually, the Center shall submit to Con-
8 gress a report on the findings of the audit
9 under paragraph (1) for the preceding year and
10 the status of any corrective measures imposed
11 as a result of the audit.

12 “(B) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—

13 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Each report under
14 subparagraph (A) shall be made available
15 to the public.

16 “(ii) PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE IN-
17 FORMATION.—A report made available to
18 the public shall not include the personally
19 identifiable information of any individual.”.
